Mardi Gras & Carneval

- Mardi Gras is a celebration in February.
- There is music, dance, colourful parades and costumes.
- During Mardi Gras there are lots of elaborate masks, costumes and parades.
- It is celebrated on Shrove Tuesday, the day before Lent starts (Ash Wednesday).
- However, the celebration is so popular in some countries that it can last for more than one day. Some even have a Mardi Gras season starting in January!
- Mardi Gras means 'Fat Tuesday' and Carnevale means 'no meat'
- Shrove Tuesday (Pancake Day in England) comes from the word 'shrive' which means to do without something to gain forgiveness from God.
- It is illegal to ride a Mardi Gras gloat without a mask.
- The official Mardi Gras colours are purple, gold and green.
 (Purple signifies justice, gold means power and green stands for faith.)
