



Cultural Capital Degree Programme

What is it?

The Cultural Capital Degree Programme is an opportunity for pupils at Moorthorpe to undertake additional study in their own time. This is open to all KS2 pupils.

Pupils can choose from any of ten subjects, each of which has four modules. The first three modules involve studying a text on a given topic (two sides of A4) then answering ten recall questions correctly. The final module involves pupils giving a five-minute presentation on an agreed topic.

What happens when you pass?

When a pupil has passed all four modules on a subject they will become a bachelor in their field. There will be a graduation assembly in front of the school and invited family members. Pupils will receive a certificate, a small prize and be included in our Hall of Fame.

At the end of each academic year, in July, all pupils in the school who are bachelors in at least one subject will be invited to take part in our University Challenge gameshow. They will be allocated to teams and questions will be based on the modules covered in the ten subjects.

Our University Challenge will be one of the biggest events in the school calendar. Family members of participants will be invited to attend. We will endeavour to invite someone notable from outside of the school to join us for the show and hand out prizes.

There will be a small prize for each participant, and of course there will be a greater reward for the winning team. This may be a trip to a local restaurant or a showing at the cinema, perhaps.
